

## URGED LEADING INFRASTRUCTURAL ACTIONS

A – Owed to the huge gap between our excellent legal framework on Wastes Management and the consistent inaction, and **illiteracy, of most officers**, magnified by lack of staff and consequent lack of response to the heavy critical environmental issues faced, we request to

- 1. Pioneer Environmental LITERACY PROGRAM for Public Servants
- 2. Call summit of outstanding Environmental Engineers to propose a **Multi-sector Strategic Plan** with key solutions for assessed problems and gather out comprehensive strategy for Wastes Management **for both Urban & Rural areas**.
- 3. Create an **Environmental Integrity Board** tackling the Environmental issues of Development assisting governing bodies to devise policies & action plans for it. **[cf. Annexure 1]**
- 4. Urgently create permanent positions for Environmental Engineers and Health Inspectors to implement and monitor Waste Management rules & projects in the Rural sector of the State [struggling with lack of qualified staff for suitable procedural guidance]
  - a) 1 Environmental Officer to each DUDC
  - b) 1 Environmental Officer to each Taluk
  - c) 2 Environmental Officers to each Zilla Panchayat
  - d) 1 Health Inspector for 10 Gram Panchayats
  - e) 1 Sanitary Landfill for 10 Gram Panchayats
- 5. To settle KSPCB detrimental understaffed condition.
- **B** As it became well-known, **MARINE LITTER**, generated from a wide variety of sources, and covering an extremely wide variety of materials, is one of the most serious fast mounting environmental problems. In order to tackle it, we request
- 1. Initiate stern actions on Marine Litter [Policy, Literacy, Prevention and Removal]
- a) Call Government agencies to design and conduct a **Marine Literacy Program for Local Bodies** (Administrators and Representatives) [Working draft with ANSSIRD]
- c) Direct strict littering control by Police [esp. seashore, water bodies, storm water drains, riverine forests]
- c) Call Coastal GPs and ULBs to pass a bylaw for **Seashore Waste Management Plan** [including chronic dumps and catchment areas]
  - d) Instruct Coastal GPs and ULBs to fix alerting boards at identified vulnerable places
- 2. Enforce a strict Plastic Ban implementation
  - a) Order the removal of all Flex banners at the entire State
  - b) Order Local Bodies to strictly stop plastic suppliers
  - c) Instruct a stern plastic control by Local Bodies, Police, Food, Excise Revenue, etc.
- 3. Spearhead the Strategic PILOT PROJECT FOR MARINE LITTER [cf. Annexure 2]
